Conventional Amendment Process

- a. One Primary Amendment (and one Secondary)
- b. Amendment is debatable, typically
- c. Amend by Inserting, Striking, or both
- d. Majority of votes cast adopts the amendment
- e. Vote can be reconsidered
- f. One Amendment per cycle
- g. Repeat the cycle
- h. The cycle is of the essence

"Series of Suggestions" (Robert)

Standard Descriptive Characteristics (some exceptions)

- a. Mover need not be recognized*
- b. Do not require a Second*
- c. Not debatable**
- d. Not amendable
- e. Require a majority vote to adopt*
- f. Vote cannot be reconsidered
- g. The voting sequence is of the essences
- * 1 exception
- ** 2 exceptions

1. Fill a Blank

- a. Motion (or Primary Amendment) moved with a Blank
- b. Member moves to insert a Blank
- c. Chair suggests to insert a Blank
- d. Motion to Create a Blank is not debatable
- e. Filling a Blank is debatable
- f. Blank can be filled with names, \$ amounts, dates, or numbers

1b. Fill a Blank

Voting Sequence (p. 162-7):

a. Blank can be filled with names, \$ amounts, dates, or numbers

- b. Names: Vote as proposed first
- c. Spend Money: Vote on least desirable first
- d. Accept Money: Vote on smallest first
- e. Others: Vote as proposed; least desirable; or largest/longest first
- f. According to incidental motion moved



2. Motion to Commit – Committee?

If more than one committee is suggested, to which committee shall the motion be referred?

- a. Committee of the Whole (New chair; recom)
- b. Quasi Committee of the Whole (Same chair; recom)
- c. Consider Informally (Same chair; final)
- d. Recommit to same previous committee
- e. Standing Committee
- f. Special Committee

2b. Motion to Commit – Committee?

Voting Sequence (p. 173):

- a. First suggestion to receive a majority, decides
- b. Standing Committee: If more than one is suggested, the first proposed Standing Committee is voted on first.
- c. Special Committee: If more than one is suggested, the Special Committee with the greatest number of members is voted on first.



3. Motion to Commit – Members?

If more than one method of appointing members to a Special Committee is suggested, which method shall be used?

- a. Election by Ballot
- b. Nominations from the floor with voice vote
- c. Nominations by the chair
- d. Appointment by the chair

Voting Sequence (p. 174):

Suggestions are voted upon as listed above. First suggestion to receive a majority, decides.

4. Previous Question

Assume 4 motions are pending

- a. Main Motion
- b. An Amendment
- c. Motion to Commit
- d. Motion to Postpone (Immediately pending question)

Suggestions

- a. Must be recognized; Requires a Second
- b. Not qualified-Call for the Question
- c. Qualified-Call for the Question
 - 1. d and c
 - 2. d, c, and b
 - 3. All

4b. Previous Question

Voting Sequence (p. 200):

- a. First suggestion to receive a 2/3 vote is adopted.
- b. If Call for the Question is not qualified, vote only on the immediately pending question (d).
- c. If Call for the Question is qualified, vote first on the suggestion that involves the greatest number of motions.
 - 1. d, c, b, and a (all)
 - 2. d, c, and b
 - 3. d and c



5. Division of a Question

- 1. <u>Separate stand-alone motions of a single subject motion</u> (Seriatim = series, not totally separate)
- 2. Assume a motion with 4 motions (A, B, C, and D)
- 3. Mover 1 suggests 2 parts: Part 1 (A); Part 2 (B, C, D)
- 4. Mover 2 suggests 2 parts: Part 1 (A, B); Part 2 (C, D)
- 5. Mover 3 ... 3 parts: Part 1 (A, B); Part 2 (C); Part 3 (D)

Voting Sequence (p. 272):

- a. The suggestion with the greatest number of parts is voted on first. (Mover 3)
- b. Suggestions with equal number of parts are voted in the order in which they were proposed. (Mover 1; Mover 2)

6. Nominations

- a. By the Chair
- **b.** From the Floor
- c. By Committee
- d. By Ballot
- e. By Mail
- f. By Petition (p.431)

Voting Sequence (p. 288):

If more than one method is suggested, the suggestions must be voted upon in the order listed above.

7. Other less Obvious Suggestions

- a. Call for the Orders of the Day (p. 219)
 - 1. Not Debatable; not Amendable
 - 2. Replaced with 3 options
 - i. Proceed to the Orders of the Day;
 - ii. Extend Debate time;
 - iii. Suspend the Rules that prohibit varying from the agenda.
- b. Elections (p. 438)
 - a. Answer the question, "What name shall we use to fill in the Blank?"

Conclusion

Amendments:

- 1. A vote on a motion or a conventional amendment answers the question, "Yes?" or "No?".
- 2. Asks one and only one question at a time.
- 3. Offers one opportunity to vote per question.

Suggestions:

- 1. A vote on a suggestion answers the "Which of the multiple-choices shall we select?"
- 2. Asks numerous questions on one question at a time.
- 3. Offers numerous opportunities to vote per question.
